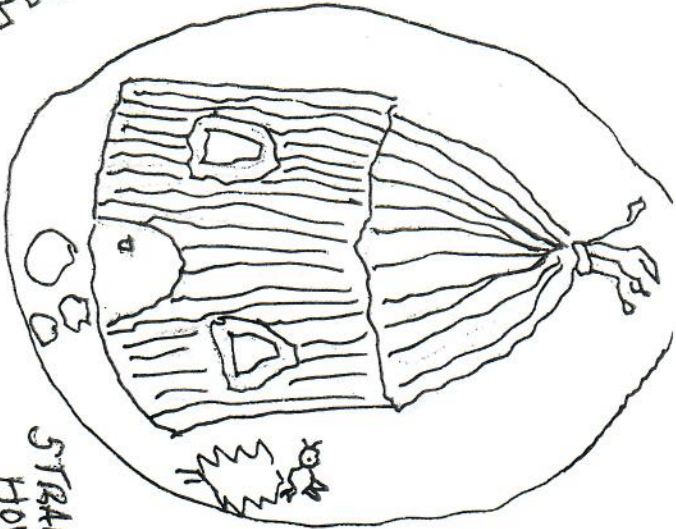
Finger Puppets

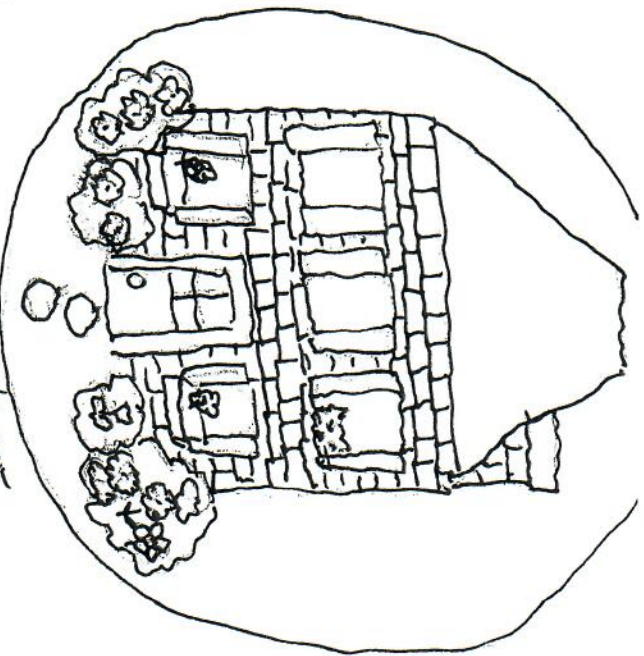




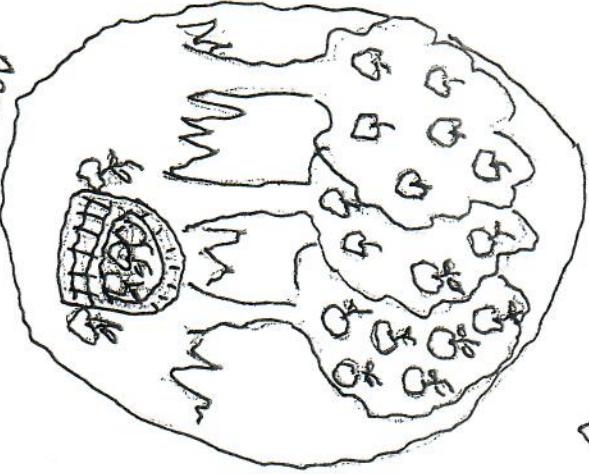
Twig House



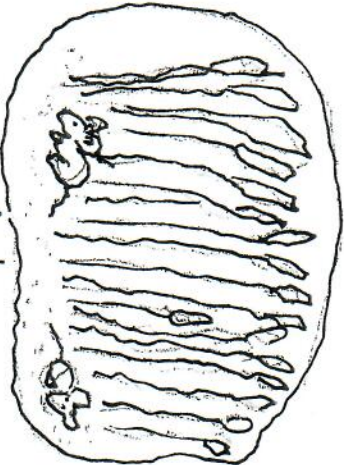
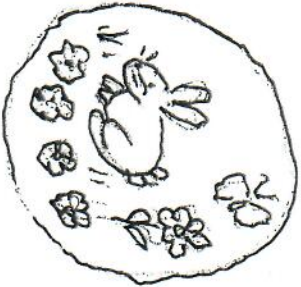
Straw House
