

LOCAL HISTORY CLIPPINGS FILE

The New Rochelle Public Library maintains an extensive Local History Clippings File of thousands of photocopied documents pertaining to ***New Rochelle-connected*** people, places, institutions, etc. This file is kept up-to-date on a regular basis, and the photocopied items come from a variety of sources.

Here follows the current alphabetical list of subjects corresponding to Clippings File subject folders. (For subjects with a *copious* accumulation of clippings, folders have been subdivided by time period, for ease of use.) Please note that, for finding information about a New Rochelle-related individual, the ***best*** place to start research is most often with the folder marked "BIOGRAPHY—" followed by the letter corresponding to that person's last name. (Note that many New Rochelle surnames for whom we lay claim to numerous articles have a folder of their own, e.g., "BIOGRAPHY—PAINE.") It might also be worthwhile to examine folders related to the organization that person may have been associated with, such as a house of worship or club. In general, folders embracing a particular profession (e.g., ACTORS AND ACTRESSES; AUTHORS; LAWYERS) consist of articles which are about ***more than one*** New Rochelle-related individual in that profession. In terms of school sports, if clippings about a sporting event/award involve a team or multiple players from only ***one*** New Rochelle school—private ***or*** public—those clippings are filed under that school name alone (e.g., "SCHOOLS—NEW ROCHELLE HIGH SCHOOL"). If the sporting event involved ***more than one*** New Rochelle school, it would be found under the more general heading "SCHOOLS—SPORTS."
