May 20, 2025.

Our sessions are a chance to learn about budget details—from funding for programs, staff, facilities and services to the priorities driving our decisions—and to share your thoughts and questions, ensuring that your voice is heard before the upcoming vote. We'll also explain how the budget impacts library services and what changes (if any) the community can expect if the budget is approved or adjusted.

We're hosting two sessions: Monday, April 7 from 6:30-7:45 PM and Monday, May 5 from 6:30-7:45 PM, in the Ossie Davis Theater (and virtually via Zoom).
